For Leicestershire the County and National Levels are used where data is available.</p>	<p><b>How does this crime compare to other crimes?</b></p> <p>This section shows the crime/incident type as a percentage of total crime (or incidents) and shows other categories to provide a context for that category. For Example within Total Recorded Crime the main crime categories are shown : Violence against the person; Serious Acquisitive Crime; Other Acquisitive Crime; Criminal damage; Sexual offences and Other offences.</p>
<p><b>Did we achieve our targets?</b></p> <p>This section highlights whether targets were met. Where no target are set the previous years figures were used. For crime and anti- social behaviour the aim is to reduce the number of crimes and incidents reported. However for domestic and hate incidents the aim is to increase reporting.</p>	<p><b>Where are the highest crime areas?</b></p> <p>This sections highlights the highest crime area by Lower Super Output Area (LSOA). The number of crimes for each area is given along with the crime rate (per 1000 population) and an indication of whether crime has gone up or down in that area compared to the previous year (↑↓). Where areas are one standard deviations above average then these areas are highlighted as High Crime levels in Leicestershire County. Where areas are more than two standard deviations above average then these areas are highlighted as highest Crime levels in Leicestershire County. For Total Recorded Crime there are 13 areas with the highest crime in the county. There are 17 high crime areas in the county.</p>	<p><b>Which communities are most affected?</b></p> <p>Three types of community classification were used to give an overall picture of the types of communities affected by crime; National Statistics Output Area Classification (OAC); Rural/Urban Definition (England &amp; Wales) and Indices of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) Quintiles for Leicestershire. Each classification is available at Lower Super output Area. 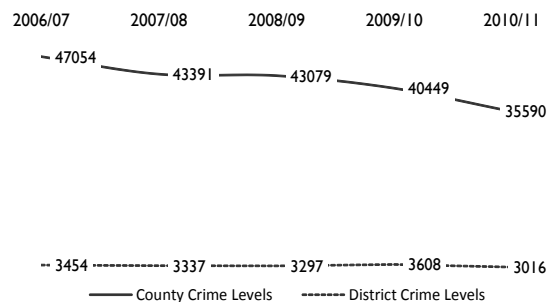

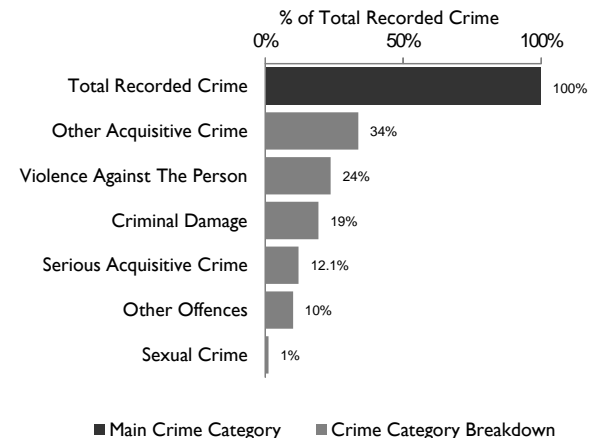
- During 2010/11 Total Recorded Crime fell by 16.4% compared to the previous year. This is better than the national figure which saw a fall of 4.3%.

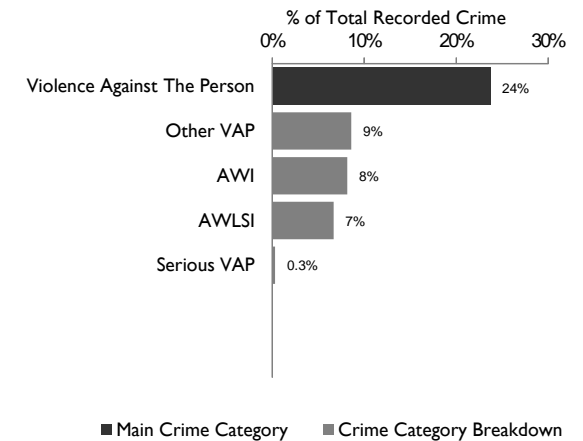

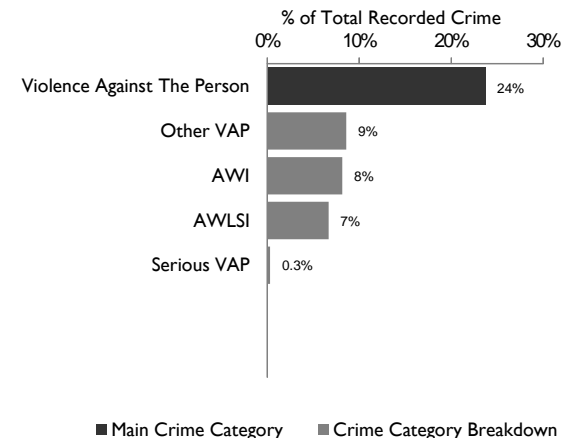

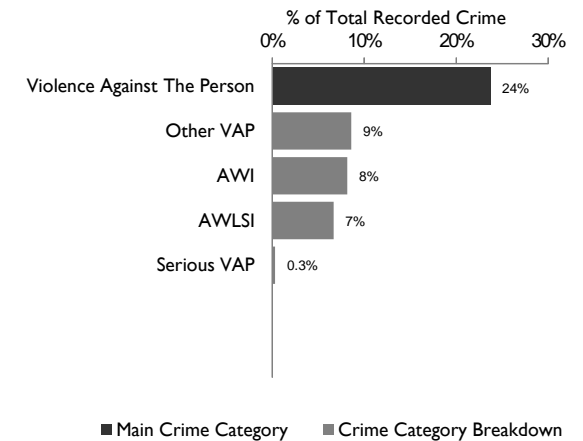

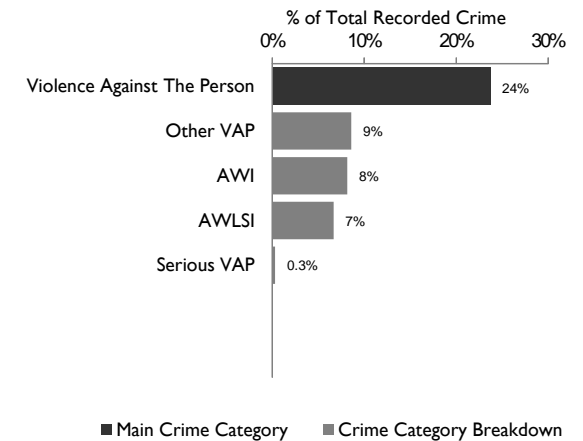

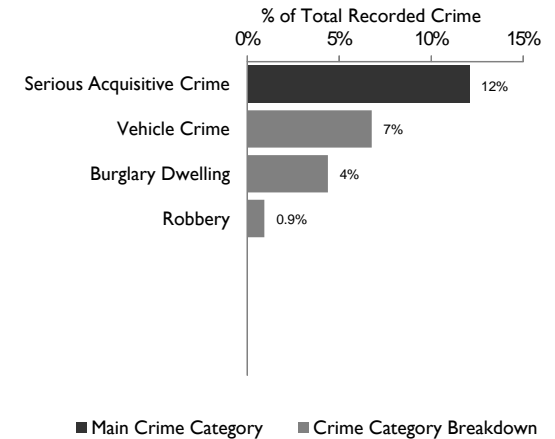

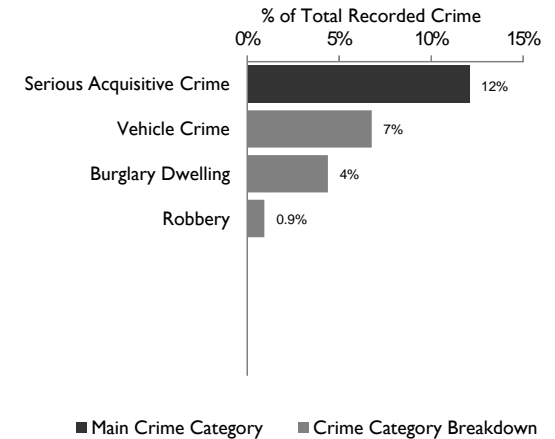
- During 2010/11 Burglary fell by 35.0% compared to the previous year. This is better than the national figure which saw a fall of 3.9%.

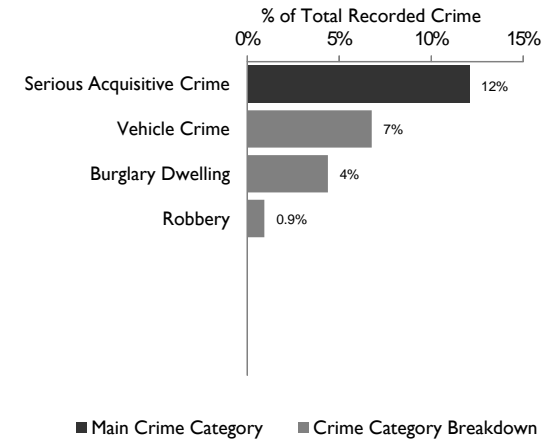
