

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INTRODUCTION

Introduction

The Indices of Deprivation 2004 are produced by the Office of the Deputy Prime Minister (ODPM). They are an attempt to measure deprivation in a consistent way for small areas across England. They were first developed in the mid 1990's using data from the 1991 Census. Since then the Indices have been revised several times using updated data and new indicators to reflect change. They have been widely used to target regeneration resources through the regional allocation of the SRB Challenge Fund.

In recent years with the release of the Indices of Deprivation (ID2000) in July 2000, use of the Indices has become more widespread. Both central and local government places a lot of value on the Indices and the Audit Commission uses it as one measure for the Quality of Life Indicators.

Indices of Deprivation 2004

The Indices of Deprivation 2004 (ID2004) were released in May 2004. The ID2004 are based on the approach, structure and methodology that was used to create the previous Indices of Deprivation 2000. The ID2004 updates the ID2000 in two key ways:

- more up-to-date data has been used (mostly 2001 data), and
- new measures have been incorporated as new and improved data sources have become available.

These changes however mean that the two indices <u>cannot</u> be directly compared. In addition many ward boundaries have changed since the release of the 2000 data meaning that straightforward comparisons cannot be made. Therefore change over time <u>cannot</u> be identified.

This Report

This report presents the results of the Indices of Deprivation 2004 in Oadby and Wigston borough.

It considers the summary measures used to score and rank the borough in relation to other Local Authority Districts in England.

It also includes details of different aspects of deprivation affecting smaller areas within the borough. A series of maps are included and illustrate where the relatively higher levels of deprivation are located.

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SUMMARY

Oadby and Wigston Borough Summary

ODPM uses six summary measures to rank district authorities in England. The most commonly used measure is the Rank of Average Rank which measures the average levels of deprivation across the borough. This shows that Oadby and Wigston borough is ranked 304th out of the 354 district authorities in England, where 1=most deprived and 354=least deprived. Table 1 below shows that only Blaby District and Harborough District are ranked as less deprived in Leicestershire.



Other measures which are used to rank district authorities include the Rank of Local Concentration. This measures the severity of multiple deprivation in each authority, measuring 'hot spots' of deprivation. Oadby and Wigston is ranked 264th in England showing that the borough experiences relatively low levels of deprivation.

The districts are also ranked on an Income and Employment Scale. This measures the number of people who are considered to be either income or employment deprived in each district.

The graph below shows that 4.133 people are income deprived and 2.055 people are employment deprived in Oadby and Wigston.

The examination of Super Output Area data in each domain highlights the locations where deprivation is concentrated in the borough.

GEOGRAPHY

Indices of Deprivation: Geography

For the first time, the Indices of Deprivation 2004 have been released at Super Output Area (SOA) lower level – where previous Indices were released at ward level.

Super Output Areas are a new national geography created by the Office for National Statistics. They are created by combining a number of Output Areas which were created for the 2001 Census.

Super Output Areas are small areas of broadly consistent population size across the country, each containing approximately 1,500 people.

The use of Super Output Areas (lower level) as a basis for the Indices enables smaller, sub-ward areas of deprivation to be identified. Such areas may previously have been hidden / masked by the use of ward level data.

Oadby and Wigston borough contains 36 Super Output Areas.



In all cases, a ranking of 1 signifies the most deprived area. In respect of the national ranking which is given in each of the following tables, a ranking between 1 and 3,248 denotes that the area is ranked within the 10% most deprived in England, and a ranking between 1 and 6,496 denotes that the area is ranked within the 20% most deprived in England.

Map 1 shows the location of each of the Super Output Areas in Oadby and Wigston borough. Each Super Output Area is identified by a nine digit code, eg. E0102**5975.** For ease of use, Map 1 lists only the last four digits.


The picture below shows how a number of Super Output Areas (normally between two and five) are located within ward boundaries, so for example Oadby Uplands ward contains three SOAs – 5979, 5980 and 5981.

For information, this report also contains the ward in which each SOA is located. However, where a ward name is given, users should be aware that it relates only to part of the ward, and not necessarily the entire ward.

Local data

The Index of Multiple Deprivation 2004 (IMD2004) combines indicators across seven domains into a single deprivation score and rank for each Super Output Area. The domains are shown below:

- Income Deprivation
- Employment Deprivation
- Health Deprivation and Disability
- Education, Skills and Training Deprivation
- Barriers to Housing and Services
- Living Environment Deprivation
- Crime

There are also two supplementary domains which measure income deprivation affecting children (IDAC) and income deprivation affecting older people (IDAOP).

These domains are given the following weighting when calculating the overall Index of Multiple Deprivation:

Income Deprivation	22.5%
Employment Deprivation	22.5%
Health Deprivation and Disability	13.5%
Education, Skills and Training Deprivation	13.5%
Barriers to Housing and Services	9.3%
Living Environment Deprivation	9.3%
Crime	9.3%

The following sections consider the relative levels of deprivation experienced in each domain in Oadby and Wigston.

Information on the indicators used to compile each domain is listed along with a table showing the ten most deprived SOAs in the borough in each domain.

For comparison, some tables also include the ranking in Leicestershire (where 1=most deprived, 396=least deprived) and in England (where 1=most deprived, 32,482=least deprived).

Each section also includes a graph which shows the number of Super Output Areas in each domain and how they are ranked within England. This gives a visual representation of the spread of relative deprivation in each domain in the borough, showing how many areas are in the 10% most deprived and 10% least deprived in England.

This information is accompanied by Maps 2 to 11 which show the location of the most deprived areas in each domain in the borough. The 10% most deprived and 10% least deprived areas in Oadby and Wigston are highlighted on the maps.

A comprehensive list of national ranks for each Super Output Area in each domain is included in appendix 1.

INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION

Indicators

The Index of Multiple Deprivation combines the indicators across the seven domains (listed below) into a single deprivation score and rank for each Super Output Area

- Income
- Employment
- Health & Disability
- Education & Skills
- Barriers to Housing & Services
- Living Environment
- Crime

Commentary

The Index of Multiple Deprivation considers all aspects of deprivation experienced by particular areas. Overall levels of deprivation in Oadby and Wigston are low, with no Super Output Areas ranked within the 30% most deprived in England and only seven areas ranked in the 50% most deprived in England. The majority of areas are ranked within the 20% least deprived in England.

Part of Wigston All Saints ward is considered to be the most deprived in the borough – shown on Map 2. However, it is ranked only 10,603 most deprived in England, and 18th most deprived in the county. The other areas in the borough that are ranked highly include parts of Wigston Fields and South Wigston wards.

Graph 2: Spread of National Ranking of all SOAs in Oadby and Wigston




INCOME DEPRIVATION

Indicators

The income deprivation domain measures the proportion of the population living below 60% of median income. A number of indicators are used to compile this domain. These include:

- Adults and children in Income Support households
- Adults and children in Income Based Job Seekers Allowance households
- Adults and children in Working Family Tax Credit households
- Adults and children in Disabled Persons Tax Credit households
- Supported asylum seekers in receipt of subsistence only and accommodation support

Commentary

The score gives the proportion of the population who are considered to be income deprived. In Oadby and Wigston there are **4,133 people** who are considered to be income deprived. Graph 3 shows the spread of rankings for all Super Output Areas in the borough. It shows that no areas are ranked within the 20% most deprived in England, and only ten are ranked within the 50% most deprived.

Table 4 lists the number of people in the most deprived Super Output Areas who are income deprived.

Map 3 shows the most deprived areas in the borough in this domain. Parts of South Wigston, Wigston All Saints and Wigston Fields wards are ranked as being the most deprived, and each of these Super Output Areas contain over 200 people who are income deprived.

Graph 3: Spread of National Ranking of all SOAs in Oadby and Wigston




INCOME DEPRIVATION AFFECTING CHILDREN

Indicators

This is a supplementary indicator that measures the proportion of children under 16 in an area who live in income deprived households.

Commentary

Overall, there are 1,142 children in Oadby and Wigston living in households which are considered to be income deprived. This accounts for 10.3% of the children in the borough aged under 16 years. More than half of these children live in the ten most deprived Super Output Areas.

Of the 4,133 people who are income deprived in Oadby and Wigston, 27.6% are aged 16 or under.

Map 4 shows the locations of the Super Output Areas that are ranked as most deprived in the borough. It should be remembered that only three Super Output Areas within the borough are ranked in the 30% most deprived in England – as shown on graph 4.

The wards with the highest numbers of children living in households which are income deprived are South Wigston (300 children) and Wigston Fields (245 children).

Graph 4: Spread of National Ranking of all SOAs in Oadby and Wigston




INCOME DEPRIVATION AFFECTING OLDER PEOPLE

Indicators

This is a supplementary indicator that measures the proportion of people aged over 60 years in an area who live in income deprived households.

Commentary

Overall there are 1,382 people aged over 60 living in income deprived households in the borough. This accounts for 9.8% of the people aged over 60 in the borough.

It also shows that of the 4,133 people who are income deprived in Oadby and Wigston, 33.4% are aged over 60.

Graph 5 shows that there are 9 Super Output Areas ranked within the 50% most deprived in England in this domain. Three of these areas, part of Wigston All Saints and South Wigston wards are ranked within the 30% most deprived in England.

Map 5 shows the location of the areas which are ranked as most deprived in the borough.

Graph 5: Spread of National Ranking of all SOAs in Oadby and Wigston




EMPLOYMENT DEPRIVATION

Indicators

The employment deprivation domain measures the proportion of the working age population that are involuntarily excluded from the world of work. It includes both those who are registered as unemployed, but also includes elements of the more 'hidden unemployed' such as those who are out of the workforce through sickness. The indicators used are:

- Unemployment claimant count
- Incapacity Benefit claimants
- Severe Disablement Allowance claimants
- Participants in New Deal

Commentary

In Oadby and Wigston, there are **2,055 people** who are employment deprived.

There are two Super Output Areas which are ranked within the 30% most deprived in England: parts of Wigston All Saints and Oadby St Peters wards. These SOAs are also within the twenty most deprived SOAs in the county.

Graph 6: Spread of National Ranking of all SOAs in Oadby and Wigston




HEALTH DEPRIVATION AND DISABILITY

Indicators

This domain identifies areas with relatively high rates of people who die prematurely or whose quality of life is impaired by poor health or who are disabled. The indicators used to compile this domain include:

- Years of potential life lost
- · Comparative Illness and Disability Ratio
- · Measures of emergency admissions to hospital
- Measure of adults under 60 suffering from mood or anxiety disorders

Commentary

Levels of health deprivation in Oadby and Wigston are relatively low with only one Super Output Area ranked within the 50% most deprived in England, part of Wigston All Saints ward. This area is also ranked 13th most deprived in the county.

Map 7 shows where the relative levels of health deprivation are higher.

Graph 7: Spread of National Ranking of all SOAs in Oadby and Wigston




EDUCATION, SKILLS AND TRAINING

Indicators

This domain captures the extent of deprivation in education, skills and training of people living in a local area. The indicators used are:

Children / young people

- Average points score of pupils at Key Stage 2
- Average points score of pupils at Key Stage 3
- Average points score of pupils at Key Stage 4
- Proportion of young people not staying on in school or further education above 16
- · Secondary school absence rate
- Proportion of those aged under 21 not entering higher education

Skills

Proportion of working age adults with no or low qualifications

Commentary

The borough experiences higher levels of deprivation in this domain than in any other. There are 15 Super Output Areas ranked within the 50% most deprived in England, four of which are within the 20% most deprived in England.

The two wards which are worst affected are Wigston Fields which has two Super Output Areas and South Wigston ward where four of its five Super Output Areas are ranked within the 30% most deprived in England. This is clearly shown on Map 8 which demonstrates that the areas which are more deprived are located in the west of the borough, and the areas which are ranked less deprived are located in the east of the borough in Oadby.

Graph 8: Spread of National Ranking of all SOAs in Oadby and Wigston




BARRIERS TO HOUSING AND SERVICES

Indicators

This domain measures the barriers faced by the local population relating to housing along with a measure of the distance needed to travel to key local services. The indicators used are:

Wider Barriers

- Household overcrowding
- Percentage of households with assistance under the homeless provisions of housing legislation
- Difficulty of access to owner occupation

Geographical Barriers

- Road distance to GP premises
- Road distance to a supermarket or convenience store
- Road distance to a primary school
- Road distance to a Post Office

Commentary

With only two exceptions, the borough experiences low levels of deprivation in this domain with half of the Super Output Areas ranked in the 10% least deprived in England.

Higher levels of deprivation are experienced in part of Wigston Meadowcourt and Oadby Grange wards which are both ranked within the 40% most deprived in England.

The more deprived areas are shown on Map 9.

Graph 9: Spread of National Ranking of all SOAs in Oadby and Wigston




LIVING ENVIRONMENT

Indicators

This domain looks at both the indoor and outdoor living environment. The indicators used include:

Indoor Living Environment

- Social and private housing in poor condition
- Houses without central heating

Outdoor Living Environment

- Air quality
- Road traffic accidents involving injury to pedestrians and cyclists

Commentary

Whilst the majority of Super Output Areas in the borough are ranked in the 50% least deprived in the country, there are two areas which are ranked within the 20% most deprived in England. These two areas, both located in South Wigston ward, are also ranked within the ten most deprived areas in the county.

The more deprived areas are shown on Map 10.

Graph 10: Spread of National Ranking of all SOAs in Oadby and Wigston




CRIME DOMAIN

Indicators

This domain measures the rate of recorded crime for four main crime types – burglary, theft, criminal damage and violence.

Commentary

Overall levels of crime deprivation are low in Oadby and Wigston with only two Super Output Areas ranked within the 50% most deprived in England, part of Wigston Fields and Wigston All Saints wards.

Map 11 shows the areas which are considered to be more deprived.

Graph 11: Spread of National Ranking of all SOAs in Oadby and Wigston



